Bridgeburg

Downtown Fort Erie is home to several businesses and is a vibrant centre for commerce and professional activity. Four major banking institutions, a yoga studio, the Fort Erie Post Office, along with automotive, antique, retail and service businesses are well established and thriving in the Bridgeburg Historic District of Fort Erie.

Crystal Beach

Crystal Beach has long been one of Fort Erie's favourite tourist attractions. It is home to a variety of specialty shops and offers wonderful dining options. The main beach, also known as Bay Beach, continues to attract locals and visitors year after year.

Garrison Road

Ridgeway



BAY BEACH

Home to the famous Prince of Wales Stakes, the Fort Erie Race Track has offered the excitement of live thoroughbred racing for 124 years. On many race days the track hosts live music, food trucks, craft beer, a Farmers' Market, arts and crafts vendors and more. Parking and admittance is free.

SAFARI NIAGARA

This 150 acre nature park is home to over 1,000 native and exotic animals, reptiles and birds. The park also features interpretive educational displays, paddleboats, playgrounds, a splash pad, picnic areas and a high ropes course.

BOATING & FISHING




